"Foreign countries have actively taken part in Tehran International Book Fair. This contradicts what is being propagated by Western media concerning the isolation of Iran";, said this Japanese embassy worker who wanted not be named because of the sensitivity of the matter.

"When I visited Tehran International Fair I was bewildered when I saw the good relations between Iran and foreign countries";, he stated.

"If Iran's scientific and political relations with other countries were not good these countries would have participated in the fair";, he noted.

"Foreign media spread false accusations against Iran, but what I see here is different from what is propagated in Western media";, he added.

"Both the US and European media propagate against Iran. Under the impression of such ill propagation, Japanese media begin judging about Iran";, he maintained.
